Answers to June Nautical Know-It-All Questions

Editor's Note: The Know-It-All questions for July did not arrive in the floating bottle in the Centennial Lakes pond yet this month. Here are the answers to last month's questions.

- 1. A ship that has a hull number beginning with DDG, is a Guided Missile Destroyer
- 2. The eighth *Enterprise* (CVA(N) 65), the world's first nuclear-powered aircraft carrier, was launched 24 September 1960 by Newport News Shipbuilding and Drydock Co, The previous *Enterprise* (CV-6) was involved at Pearl Harbor, but not as a potential target. It was headed back to Hawaii from Wake Island during the attack. *Enterprise* scout planes arrived over Pearl Harbor during the attack and, though surprised, immediately went into action in defense of the naval base. The carrier, meanwhile, assembled her remaining aircraft in a fruitless search for the Japanese striking force.
- 3. The first US nuclear submarine was *USS Nautilus* in July of 1951. On December 12th of that year, the Navy Department announced that she would be the sixth ship of the fleet to bear the name *Nautilus*. After nearly 18 months of construction, *Nautilus* was launched on January 21, 1954. Eight months later, *Nautilus* (SSN-571) became the first commissioned nuclear powered ship in the United States Navy.
 - 4. The Mt. Rushmore president without a US aircraft carrier named after him is Thomas Jefferson.
- 5. The oldest commissioned US Navy ship is the USS Constitution, over 200 years old, originally launched October 21, 1797.
 - 6.. The 'father' of nuclear propulsion in the US Navy is Admiral Rickover.
 - 7. The crew size (with embarked airwing) of a Nimitz-class aircraft carrier is 5680.
 - 8. It was a span of 26 years between the Nimitz launch and its first refueling.
 - 9. The Naval Fleet Auxiliary Force is run by the Military Sealift Command.

The Military Sealift Command operates more than 110 ships around the world. These ships carry the designation 'USNS' (United States Naval Ships) and are not commissioned ships. Also, they are crewed by civilians. Some MSC ships also have small military departments assigned to carry out specialized military functions such as communications and supply operations.

10. The Missile Barge is not a type of US Navy ship.






