

least one vote. The winner was a tie, and just as if we would have split the voting between kids and adults, one boat was Jim Zipf's all black (and almost a fantasy version of a) Pirate Boat, and the other Dick Walkers fantastic "Der Sea Kadet".

Coming up on the afternoon of Saturday, June 28th is a wedding reception at the Centrum Building, and from New York City we have been asked if we could put the bride and grooms names on some sails and have the boats on the water for the reception.

I have the names made up, thankfully both are short, and I will be trying them on some sails to see how they look. They are on clear film so they can be taped to sails on a temporary basis. We need at least two volunteers to be there that afternoon for the wedding reception. There will be an email on this also, so one way or the other let me know if you will take this on and I will get the names to you. It is a rare opportunity for the club to do something extra for the Park in appreciation for use of their facilities that we enjoy free of any cost all year long.

There is also the Classic & Vintage Boat show at White Bear Lake at the same time on June 28th and are requesting that our RC boats be on display for the show.

Finally, remember that summer meetings start at 8:00. See you there.




