- 1/2 Pond Races We had mostly larger boats racing this year, which made lifting them around the floating bridge to the band shell to get into the south pond impractical. We had a couple of great show and tell items. The first item highlights one of the great things about the club, which is the wealth of knowledge that is available. Kevin Waldo brought a kit that he is going to be working on this winter, but had an issue with the deterioration of the cast metal parts, which he threw out to the group in attendance for direction. Several great suggestions were made and I think we need to have Kevin report back next year on how the suggestions worked out. Kevin also was looking for direction with the appearance of different types of wood. I thought the responses to this item were especially impressive and will similarly need to be reported back to the group next year.



Second item came from one of the great model builders in the club, Curt Peterson. Curt wanted a runabout but did not have the time to put into a kit. His solution was to buy a ready-for-electronics boat off of ebay. The boat is typically sold for display only, but has been offered recently in a water ready condition by having been constructed with water proof glues and epoxy coating. The boat is the RC/water ready Amati Riva Aquarama. We have seen this boat before in the club but not in the water ready format. A gorgeous boat that is not quite built to exacting standards of measurements, it is never the less a stunning boat. The is the model version of what may be the most desireable full size wooden boat ever made, it was made for the then head of Lamborguini automobile company, and one example was constructed with twin V-12 Lambogini motors. Curt had fitted the twin rudders and was working on locating the holes for the twin propeller shafts. Curt will need to show us all how this boat comes out and how it runs when it is completed. This could be a popular way to achieve that display worthy wood speed boat you always wanted!
