What about the rules?

n virtually all sports, with the possible exception of RUGBY, there are rules, officials, and penalties that control the playing of the game. Well, yacht racing is no exception.

In yacht racing, rules regulate both the on the water racing and also the participating yachts. The yacht classifications that are documented in the ONE DESIGN and DEVELOPMENTAL class rules regulate the participating yachts, and on the water racing rules generally apply to all yacht classes. As an example, some of the on the water rules infractions include, crossing the start line too early, not yielding the right of way, and hitting or passing the course marker buoys on the wrong side. Although these rules have a purpose they can be confusing to the novice sailor.

In an effort to keep the initial club racing focused on fun and building sail racing skills, the administrative committee has adopted its own simplified rules. The participating yachts will be regulated under the AMYA sanctioned yacht calcification, and the three additional yacht classes that were described in the last news letter. This means that there will be separate races for each class of yacht. For the actual racing, there are three on the water rules:

- Do not cross the start line before the start signal, the penalty, go back across the start line before continuing the race.
- Avoid collisions with other yachts, the penalty, to the offended skipper apologize and continue racing.
- 3) The yachts must pass the course marker buoys on the correct side (right or left depending on the course lay out) and there is no penalty if the marker is hit.

These rules apply only to our club's races. Regattas where other clubs are invited will have to follow the American Model Yachting Association's rules. The administrative committee does not expect that we will be in a position this year to sponsor a fully AMYA regatta. As the year progresses and racing skills improve, racing and officiating under the official rules may be considered as preparation for the 1993 season. When official race rules are adopted a rules seminar will be given.

The competitive events planned this year include Olympic course racing. This is a triangular course with two windward legs, two broad reach legs and a down wind run to the finish line. The second type of event is racing around buoys positioned in a circular course. And the third type of competitive event is *Balloon Tag*, where a

balloon is fasten to the stern of your yacht, a dowel with a pin is fasten to the bow, and the object is to pop the other yacht's balloon. The last boat with a balloon is the winner. These events are a low stress competition and an opportunity to perfect sailing skills. In time a group of hard core racers may evolve and a second set of racing events may be added that use the official rules. Right now we are learning and need the club's participation, so, for those with a competitive nature, get your yacht and join in on the fun.
