**Robbe Revisited:** Gary Phillips gave me the name of a "local" Robbe source:

Wayne advised me that his normal discount on Robbe is 20%. On orders of ten ,or more kits, he will increase that to 25%. He also gets seasonal reductions from Robbe.

As an example, the "Magnum", kit #1042 (pg.174 in catalog) which lists for \$139.95, is currently \$105. The club is on Wayne's mailing list, and he'll keep us posted on the latest "deals". Wayne says that delivery from New Jersey takes 3-4 days, and that he'll get your order on to you the same day it arrives. Gary certifies as to the speed!

**Model Images:** John Bishop put me on to "Create-A-Print" at Ritz camera. (only at Southdale, Colonial Square, Brookdale, Northtown, Ridgedale, Eden Prairie and Burnsville Centers, Mall of America and Rosedale). This is a Kodak device which allows you to make your own color enlargements from negatives. The best part is the cropping capability, which lets you fill the frame with your subject. My pondside negatives are, like our planet, mostly water, and I appreciate being able to fill the frame with boat. Prices are 3.99 for

4x11 or 5x7, 5.99 for 8x10 and 12.99 for 11x14. And! You walk out of the shop with your print in only five minutes!
