BOAT TO NOTE

Congratulations to EMYC member Jim Smith. Jim recently attended the Weak Signals R/C Club model expo in Toledo, Ohio which took place April 8th, 9th and 10th. It is one of the largest radio controlled boat and plane hobby shows in the nation and is now in its 40th year.

His newly completed, 1/24th scale "Carol M" harbor tugboat made the trip as well and placed third in the "working vessel - unarmed" category of the show. Approximately fifteen boats entered this category (one of four for boats), and for his placing efforts he was rewarded with a 5 channel Ace Nautical Commander Radio.

His "Carol M" tugboat is mostly scratch built from U.S. Boat and Ship Modeler plans and the fiberglass hull was built by club member Paul Olsen using the same plans. It is filled with all kinds of creative and innovative modeling ideas. Jim is known for his attention to detail and finishing touches, and they can be seen throughout the model. Be sure to see this impressive boat up close and on the water at the Parade of model Boats show June 12th. Congratulations, Jim.





'94 Parade of Model Boats-Final Details

The Parade of Model Boats show will take place on Sunday, June 12th, from 12:00 to 7:00PM, with the setup beginning at 10:00AM. The show is planned to provide entertainment for the general public and to introduce the hobby of radio controlled model boating. But equally important, it is a chance for our club members and model boating guests to meet new people, display and run all types of boats, and have some fun for an afternoon. It is our club's main event of the year and has proven to be very enjoyable and rewarding for those that have participated.

The show is organized in a way that will expose, up close, all aspects of the hobby. For the entire time of the show, a membership/general information table will be staffed by club members to answer specific questions about R/C boating, a building area will reveal current projects under construction, and an indoor display within the Centrun building will allow the public to view all of the boats up close when they are not running on the water. In an attempt to create an entertaining show for running, a schedule has been organized that provides for an afternoon filled with activities from noon to 7:00 PM.

The following is the schedule of events for Sunday, June 12th:

10:00 AM	Setup indoor membership, building, and display areas. Setup outdoor running and frequency control areas. Setup and test outdoor P.A. and music systems. Display signs
11:30 AM	Club Meeting in Centrum building. Review schedule, answer questions, etc.
11:45 AM	Club Members' Group Photograph outside Centrum building
12:00 PM	Open Boating introduction to R/C boating, running open to all types of boats
12:30 PM	Fairwind Fleet demonstration and racing events
1:00 PM	Electric Boats running types includes tugboats/workboats, speedboats, cruisers, pleasure craft
1:30 PM	EC/12, Marblehead, other Sailboats demonstration and racing events
2:00 PM	Open Boating introduction to R/C boating, (optional public participation)
2:30 PM	Fairwind Fleet demonstration and racing events, balloon tag
3:00 PM	Electric Boats fast electrics: speedboats, hydrofoils, etc. High speed running and group race
3:30 PM	EC/12, Marblehead, other Sailboats demonstration and racing events
4:00 PM	Open Boating introduction to R/C boating, running open to all types of boats
4:30 PM	Fairwind Fleet demonstration and group regatta event
5:00 PM	Electric Boats military emphasis: cruisers, destroyers, sub, etc.
5:30 PM	EC/12, Marblehead, other Sailboats demonstration and racing events
6:00 PM	Parade of Model Boats, all boats are individually introduced and separately run in a continuous on-water display for the general public. Boats are rotated out as event progresses so frequency congestion does not occur. Lasts approximately 30 minutes.
6:30 PM	Open Boating relaxing post-show open running for EMYC members and Parade show guests
7:00 PM	Outdoor Concert presented by the City of Edina and performed in front of the Centrum building

The **indoor display** is a great opportunity for you to show your boat(s) within the Centrum building and you are encouraged whenever not running to have your boats in this area. It will be protected by EMYC members at all times and certain areas of the room will be roped off to provide extra protection for those that want non-public-contact protection for their models.

The **membership/general information** table will provide a focal point for information about the hobby of radio controlled boating, the organization of the Edina Model Yacht Club, and information about the group and its activities. It will also act as a resource area for handing out literature. This area will be located in the entry of the Centrum building.

The **building projects** table will also be located in the entry area. If you are currently in the process of dry dock construction and would like to give people the "shop view" of your boat, please bring it along. This often gives those not associated with the hobby a better understanding of the time and effort involved in finishing a boating project.

Frequency Control will allow us to track 36+ channels for independent operation of the boats. The frequency board will be used and if you run you will need to have a clip attached to your transmitter antenna displaying the frequency you're on. If you have finished running, please return the clip promptly. Conflicts will be resolved by sharing the available time for an event, or by changing out crystals. The EMYC has five additional crystals that can be loaned out, but if you have extra personal crystals please bring them as well. Transmitters may be stored in a protected area within the Centrum building free from public access, but each radio remains the personal responsibility of its respective owner. Charging and repairs may also take place within this area.


All participating club members will have a chance at drawing for **donated products** from various manufacturers at the end of the show. This is always a fun and exciting way to wrap up the event and a way to show our appreciation to the EMYC club members that help to make this show possible.

Involvement within the Parade of Model Boats is a rewarding part of the show. A lot of enthusiasm is usually generated during this event and the more you become involved the more you'll enjoy this event. Three different areas will be staffed by members-- membership/general information, frequency control, and the indoor display-- and if you would like to sign up for a one hour time slot in any of these areas please attend the upcoming May meeting or call John Bishop at (a manning chart is currently being created). Additionally, if you would be interested in helping out in any other way for the Parade show please let the club know.

Additional items in no particular order: food and drinks will be available from the concessions counter within the Centrum building from 11:00 AM to 9:00 PM. Food is also available from the surrounding complex and covers everything from fast to fine dining. Members and guests will be able to relax within an environment of couches and chairs (behind the scenes) throughout the day. Benches will be set up outside for spectators' comfort. Paddle boats will be rented out but will not be allowed to run beyond the flagged-off area just North-East of the Centrum building. The water of Centennial Lakes will be treated by June 12th and hopefully weed-free.

This newsletter is sent out to club members, local hobby shops, and R/C boating clubs throughout the midwest area. If you are not a club member but would like to participate in this event, please feel free to attend and run with us. 


