Builder's Corner: Northwest Short Lines (NWSL), a model railroad supplier in Seattle has solid acetal (Delrin™ to you) universal joints for a variety of shaft sizes from 1.2mm up to 5/32". They are a press fit to the designated shaft, however for you belt and suspender types, they have sufficient material to allow drilling for a set screw. One is going in my 21" tug during refit this winter. I hope to have a few samples in time for the swap meet.

Survey Results: The details of the recent survey of members is contained within this newsletter. The 'Dry Dock Party', 'Parade' and 'Picnic' rate right up there as favorites. It appears that the members enjoy the informal gatherings which bring us together to socialize and visit with one another.

National (Chicago) Model & Hobby Show: I attended the hobby expo in Chicago over the weekend of Oct.28th. If you have varied interests, including trains, planes and boats, it is a good show.

At the Dumas display, I had a chance to ask them about the sale of fiberglass hull seconds. They do have them but you must call them as they change all the time and are sold on a first come basis. Prices vary, but are approximately one half of what a normal hull would retail for. As for their prop supply, it is getting better and should be in full production by January. They do have several new items and their latest catalog is in the club file cabinet.

There are several new speed controls available. MCD has a new micro size Super Minicon which has a 10 Amp capacity for 4.8 to 15 volts. Great for small to medium sized scale boats. Retail price is \$69.95. They have also updated their larger SC300 unit. Ace had their long delayed, reversable Smart Throttle which is good up to 35 Amps and will control 26 cells. Price on that controller is \$74.95.

Sub Tech (908-206-1573) will soon offer a new eight channel radio specifically designed for boats. It is designed by the former owner and designer of Ace radios. It has some very nice features such as dual throttle (or sail) control and will be in the \$220 range.

For those interested in fast electrics, I picked up a new catalog from Trinity motors which contains some very good information. It's in the club file. Gary Phillips
