The events will include monohull oval racing, a relay race, a hydro-plane demonstration, and even some stuff we haven't thought of yet. If you have a boat that goes fast, or was intended to go fast, be sure to bring it. The event will run until 4:30 PM. Builder's Corner: If you are interested in building the Voltage Regulator / battery eliminator that John Bishop described in the last newsletter, be advised that several of the more difficult parts to find (e.g. microchip, heatsink, terminal bar) are available from member, Joe Hjelmstad.

Parking: Park Manager, Tom Shirley has advised us that it is permissible to drive your vehicle up to the Centrum or pond for unloading, however this should only be done if your boat is exceptionally large or unwieldy. Your vehicle should be removed immediately thereafter to a designated parking area. It would be prudent to have a buddy clear the way for you while driving in the normally pedestrian areas.

Membership Update: 64 members have joined or renewed for 1996. 26 memberships have expired. We will have renewal forms available at the Parade.

Deadline: The newsletter should be back on a normal schedule for July. The deadline for submissions is July 2nd, with mailing on the 8th. Send me somethin'!! Ed.

Membership Meeting, 5/21/96: 32 members in attendance. Dan Proulx spoke on the Parade of Boats schedule. Volunteers should arrive at 10:00AM the day of the show to begin setup. Flyers for the show were available to distribute. John Bishop talked about the revised schedule for this year - mainly on the shortened schedule of events to keep spectators interested. John also encouraged members to bring boats - finished or unfinished for the indoor display area. Show will officially end at 4:00, however members can stay as late as they want. (The usual Sunday open boating period commencing at 4:30 is still in effect. Ed.) Parade schedule will be posted at the Centrum building. Jeff McCabe talked about a city concern that members promptly park their vehicle if they need to bring their boat closer to the pond with their vehicle. Doug Campbell mentioned a proposed racing schedule at the north pond that was discussed with Tony Johnson: Tuesday is open racing, meaning that any class (sail or


electric) that wishes to race at the north pond may do so. Particulars would be worked out at that time as to sharing the waters if needed. Thursday would be reserved to primarily 914 sailboats. Sunday would again be open racing. Jeff talked about ideas on enclosing the club's garage space. One idea would be a chain link gate enclosure. A model boat contest at Manitowoc. WI was mentioned. It will be August 3-4. Application forms were available at the meeting. (See May newsletter. Ed.) Dave Ulmer brought up that the board make the Kyosho Viper the official club fast electric race boat. Jim Smith questioned the need for such a designation. Discussion on the subject was tabled for another time. Jim Smith reported that prior to the meeting, 62 members had renewed their membership, while 26 had yet to do so. Business adjourned. Dave Bros talked on finishing techniques. Doug Campbell
