Batteries Revisited: Ken Stoltenberg passed along the following information from Power Sonic relating to their gel-cells.

"The nominal rating of gell cell batteries is calculated at a 20 hour rate". So, a 3AH cell would produce 150mA for 20 hours, while a 10AH cell would produce 500mA for the same period of time.

Since I draw about 3 Amps (3000mA) from my tug's 10AH battery, it appears that I can not expect to receive full capacity since I am drawing the battery down at about six times the calculated rate.

Power Sonic's literature also recommends charging a 12v. gell cell at 14.7 volts for 16 hours, followed by a "floating" continuous voltage of 13.5 - 13.8v.

Ace recommends that the output voltage of their Constant Voltage Charger for gel-cells be set at 14.2 volts, so there seems to be a bit of "wiggle room" available.

Where To Get 'Em?: Warren Freeman recommends Burns Sales Co., 4601 Excelsior Blvd, Mpls, 55416 as a source for gell-cells. Check 'em out
